# **ALCOHOL**

At the Tuesday, September 13th Orange County Board of County Commissioners meeting, Commissioner Scott Boyd opened discussions relating to CFHLA's request to amend Orange County's alcohol ordinance relating to hours of sale/service.

Last month, CFHLA requested that Orange County change its hours of alcohol sale/service at professional dining and lodging

establishments to begin at 7 AM and conclude at 2 AM, compared to the existing time of 11 AM - 2 AM.

The Commissioners and Mayor Jacobs indicated their willingness to move forward with the proposal, suggesting that a public workshop be scheduled as the first step in amending the County ordinance.

# **BEWES**

On Thursday, September 15th, the **Orlando City Council** voted to delay action on a plan that would require buildings larger than 50,000 square feet to **report their water and electrical usage** annually and receive performance scores.

This mandatory reporting ordinance, the **Building Energy and Water Efficiency Strategy (BEWES)**, has faced significant opposition from the Orlando business community due to its potentially negative economic impact on the city.

On May 2nd, CFHLA sent a letter to Mayor Buddy Dyer and the City Council, advocating that the BEWES ordinance be a "voluntary, incentive-based" program.

Another group opposing the BEWES ordinance as it is currently being proposed is the **Building Owners and Managers Association**, who have argued that releasing the energy audit data of older, less efficient buildings could lead to the need for expensive renovations which would drive up residential and commercial rental costs in the city.

Mayor Dyer is expected to bring the ordinance back for review

at an undetermined October City Council meeting. CFHLA will continue meeting with City leadership to advocate for a voluntary implementation of this program.
